SEVENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, when World War 2 ended in Europe, a young mother wrote a letter to her son. "My dear son," she began. "Today is victory for our country. The Germans have surrendered. You don't know what that means, Terry, for you are only four years old. But it means freedom—freedom for so many of all races and nationalities and faiths—freedom of religion, freedom to talk the way you want to, the way God meant for people to go to church, have children, get up in the morning and go to work, gather on street corners and talk with their friends and not have to worry about being oppressed for thinking and talking about the things that are in their hearts.

"It is hard for me to write, Terry, for my eyes are full of tears of gladness for the parents and boys that made this dream come true . . . But I feel this so strong in my heart, my son, that I must write this so that when you grow into manhood and read this, it will convey into your heart the thanks and appreciation you owe these GI Joes of World War 2.

"The radio is bringing to the public the privilege of hearing the true facts of this terrible conflict. There is martial music and religious hymns . . . prayers of thanks for being delivered from oppression, prayers of thanks that the boys over there may now be allowed to come home and to carry on in a normal manner, to be able to pray in church instead of a foxhole and to live by the commandment, 'Thou shalt not kill.'

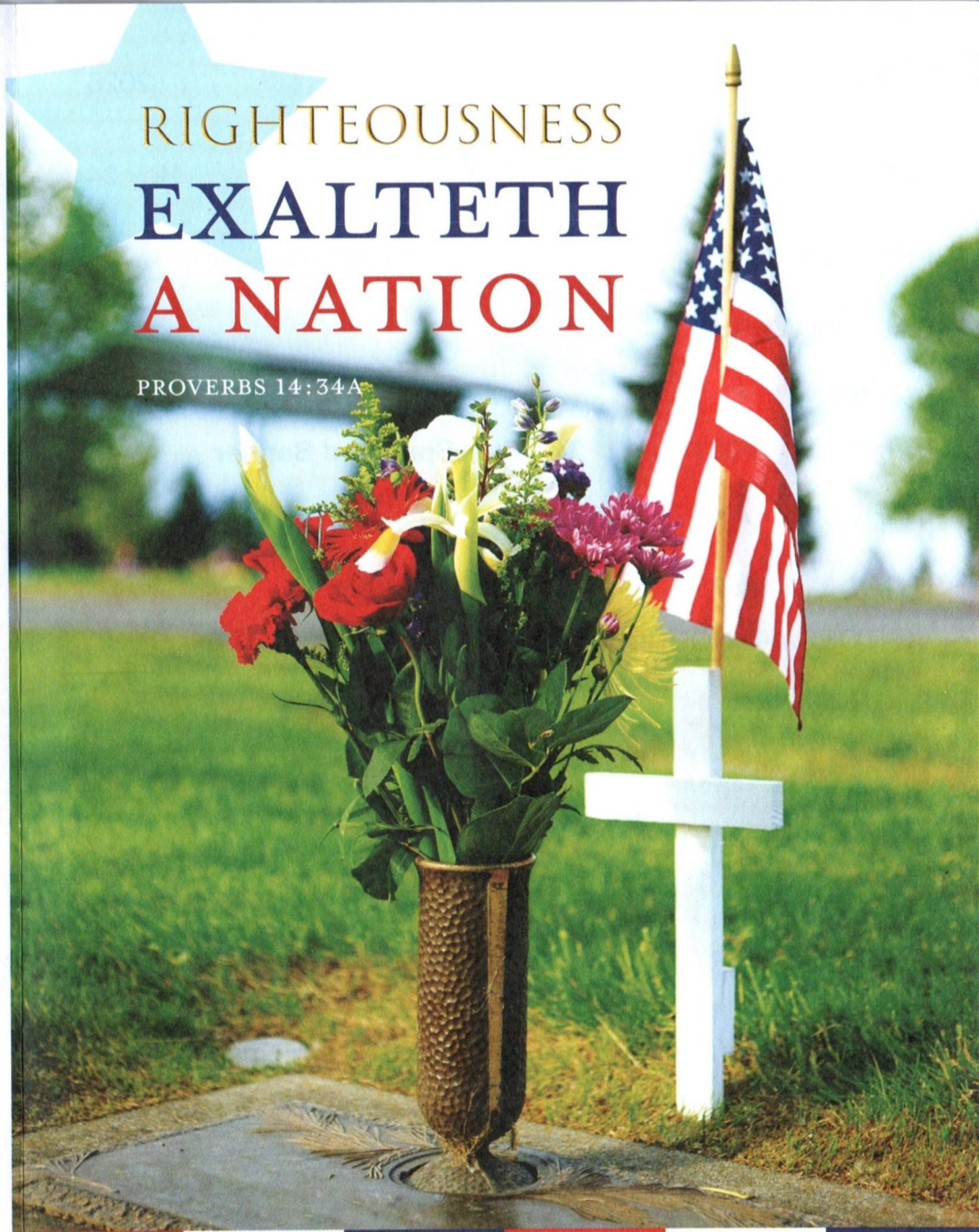
"Church bells are ringing, factory whistles are blowing—but it is a quiet celebration. People are leaving their homes to go to church and give thanks to God. I only hope, Terry, I have expressed myself sufficiently so that you will know . . . what a wonderful day this is for people of all nations and that you give thanks every day of your life that you and your brother can grow up as normal boys . . . in this wonderful country of ours. Your mother."
