What the Blind Man Saw

Seldom does someone born blind gain eyesight. But in John 9 we find the familiar story of Jesus opening the eyes of a blind man. There is so much in this chapter, we could never exhaust the lessons found there, so let us look at just three things that the blind man saw.

First, he saw a servant in Jesus Christ who “Made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant” (Philippians 2:7). A servant who saw and had compassion on a fellow man. A servant who was willing to get His hands dirty and do the work of the Father who had sent Him. A servant who was willing to reach out to serve a fallen, sinful man. No, the blind man was not blind because of sin, and neither was he a sinner because he was blind. But nonetheless he was a sinner, for all have sinned.

Secondly, he saw the skeptics, starting with those who knew him. They couldn’t believe it was he, for “How could one born blind now see?” Neither would the religious scholars believe. According to them, Jesus had worked on the Sabbath, so he must be a sinner, and “How can a man that is a sinner do such miracles?” (John 9:16).

Lastly, and most importantly, he saw the Savior. At first he saw simply a savior who had given him sight. We read his response to the skeptics in John 9:25: “Whether he be a sinner or no, I know not: one thing I know, that, whereas I was blind, now I see.” He didn’t have to be a theologian to know that once he was blind, but now he was not. Then he saw the Savior who saved his soul. In verse 35 of John 9, Jesus asked him if he believed on the Son of God, and in verse 38, “He said, Lord, I believe. And he worshipped him.”
